Applications for admission to Cambourne Sixth Form should be sent directly to the college, using the online application form at [www.mychoice16.co.uk](http://www.mychoice16.co.uk) by the published deadline.

Cambourne Sixth Form is a Level 3 centre offering a range of courses:

- Level 3 BTECs
- A-Level Qualifications
- Level 3 Cambridge International Project Qualification (IPQ)
- Level 3 Extended Project Qualification (EPQ)
- Level 3 Core Maths Qualification

Students can also access a GCSE (Level 2) re-sit course in English Language and Mathematics

Details of the courses on offer each year can be found in the appropriate prospectus.

#### ENTRY REQUIREMENT

##### A-Level Courses Available to Students

The intention is for the following A-Levels to be available, the vast majority of which will be delivered on site at Cambourne Sixth Form. In rare circumstances, to accommodate fluctuations in student numbers and staffing models, Trust Sixth Forms may collaborate to deliver courses, which may involve elements of online learning. The A-Level offer for a particular year will be confirmed in the prospectus, and the mode of delivery will be confirmed directly to applicants when offers are made.

The usual minimum GCSE entry requirements for each A-Level are indicated next to each course. This is in addition to the following GCSE requirements to study A-Level courses.

##### Minimum Entry Requirements:

To study three A-levels: a minimum of 5 grade 5s at GCSE (including at least a 4 in English and Maths)

To study four A-levels: a minimum of 5 grade 7s is needed.

<b>Chemistry</b>	6 in GCSE Chemistry if doing single sciences Or 6,7 in GCSE Trilogy Science 6 in GCSE Maths
<b>Computer Science</b>	6 in GCSE Maths 6 in Computing if taken at GCSE
<b>Design Technology</b>	6 in DT if taken at GCSE
<b>Drama</b>	6 in Drama if taken at GCSE
<b>Economics</b>	6 in Maths GCSE
<b>English Language</b>	6 in GCSE English Language or English Literature
<b>English Literature</b>	6 in English Literature GCSE
<b>Environmental Science</b>	None
<b>French</b>	6 in GCSE French
<b>Geography</b>	6 in GCSE Geography
<b>German</b>	6 in GCSE German
<b>History</b>	6 in GCSE History or a 6 in a humanities subject
<b>Maths</b>	7 in GCSE Maths
<b>Double Maths</b>	8 in GCSE Maths
<b>Music</b>	6 in GCSE Music, if taken and at least one instrument/voice to Grade 5 If Music is not taken at GCSE, then Grade 5 or above in an instrument and in theory of music is required.
<b>Music Technology</b>	None
<b>Photography</b>	6 in Photography GCSE
<b>Physical Education</b>	6 in PE if taken at GCSE. Students must be competing in a sport at club level.
<b>Physics</b>	6 in GCSE Physics if doing single sciences Or 6,7 in GCSE Trilogy Science 6 in GCSE Maths
<b>Politics</b>	6 in a humanities GCSE or English GCSE
<b>Psychology</b>	5 in GCSE Maths 6 in GCSE English or in a humanities subject
<b>Philosophy</b>	6 in a humanities subject
<b>Sociology</b>	6 in a humanities subject or English GCSE
<b>Spanish</b>	6 in GCSE Spanish

### LEVEL 3 CAMBRIDGE INTERNATIONAL PROJECT QUALIFICATION

A minimum of 5 grade 7s at GCSE. Exceptions to the above may be made in highly exceptional circumstances.

### Applied Level 3 Courses

The intention is for the following Applied Level 3 courses to be available. The Applied Level offer for a particular year will be confirmed in the prospectus.

Course-specific requirements are stated with each specific course. This is in addition to the following general GCSE requirements for any of these programmes:

#### Minimum Entry Requirements:

- A minimum of 5 grade 4s at GCSE, including at least a 4 in English and Maths
- If a Level 2 BTEC forms part of the offer, a Pass, Merit or Distinction will be required
- A maximum of 2 Level 2 BTECs or vocational courses will be considered

### **BTEC Level 3 Qualifications**

<b>BTEC Business</b>	At least a 4 in Business if taken at GCSE At least a Pass in Business if taken at BTEC Level 2 *Please note that Level 2 vocational courses are the equivalent of one GCSE and only two will be counted towards the entry requirements
<b>BTEC Sport</b>	At least a 4 in PE if taken at GCSE At least a Pass in Sport if taken at BTEC Level 2 *Please note that Level 2 vocational courses are the equivalent of one GCSE and only two will be counted towards the entry requirements

### **ADMISSION NUMBER**

The Year 12 cohort is expected to be up to 180 students, including places for students from Cambourne and further afield, subject to admissions criteria.

Please note that the availability of places in certain curriculum subjects may determine if the oversubscription criteria detailed below are applied. Entry to Cambourne Sixth Form will not be determined by a formal interview, but an informal guidance meeting will be held to advise students on appropriate course selection and expectations. A written reference will be sought from the current school as to the suitability or otherwise of the course and level being considered.

### **OVERSUBSCRIPTION OF QUALIFIED APPLICANTS**

The revised School Admissions Code allows the opportunity for over-admission if the demand for available courses can be met (see section 1.43), the College reserves the right to apply the admission criteria below where the permitted flexibility is likely to prejudice the efficiency and effectiveness of Cambourne Sixth Form's provision.

Those students who have an EHCP naming Cambourne Sixth Form will be admitted if courses deemed appropriate by the Sixth Form Leadership Team are available.

The admission criteria to be used in the case of oversubscription of first choice applicants are as follows:

- Students in Care, also known as Looked After Children (LAC) and children who were looked after but ceased to be so by reason of adoption, a residence order or special guardianship order
- Students who attend Cambourne Village College, Comberton Village College or Melbourn Village College at the time of admission
- Students who attend CAP\* schools or who currently live with their parent(s) in the Local Authority defined areas served by these schools
- Students who make an application from outside the CAP\*
- Students who are close to but do not meet the published entry requirements

### **OVERSUBSCRIPTION IN A CATEGORY**



Priority will be given to students living nearest to Cambourne Sixth Form, as measured by a straight line. The distance, for admissions purposes, is measured using the straight line distance from the centre point of the home to the main student entrance to Cambourne Sixth Form. For families who live outside the area covered by the Cambridgeshire mapping system, distances are determined using a combination of local maps and on-line resources.

Parents and students have a right to appeal against any decision refusing a Sixth Form place in a school with a Sixth Form. Appeals must be heard by an independent panel within 40 school days of the appeal being lodged.

### **INTERVIEW POLICY**

Entry to Cambourne Sixth Form will not be by formal interview, but an informal guidance meeting will be held to advise students on appropriate course selection and expectations.

We aim to offer a guidance meeting to all appropriate first and second choice applicants who meet the admissions criteria, in line with Trust Sixth Forms.
